Students have signed up to lead as servant patrollers, chapel assistants, class representatives, reporters, and so much more.

We have monthly themes for our elementary chapel. August was our kindness month and September we will talk about being helpful like Johnny Appleseed. The entire CBS elementary school has adopted Class Dojo as one of our classroom management systems. By now you should have received a login on how to participate in Class Dojo and should log on so that you can see how your children are doing daily with their behavior. If you need more information about Class Dojo, please contact your child's teacher if you have not received this information. Kindergarten through 5th grade have access to Moby Max. This is a program that helps students to practice their skills anywhere when they need extra practice with a skill in math or language arts/reading. Students should have received their log in from their teacher. For more information about this academic practice for students, please contact your child's teacher. 1st through 5th grade participate in our Accelerated Reading program. Students read books at home and have their parents sign that they have read these books. They take quizzes in class monitored by their teacher. Students cannot take AR quizzes at home. They are only to be taken at school.
